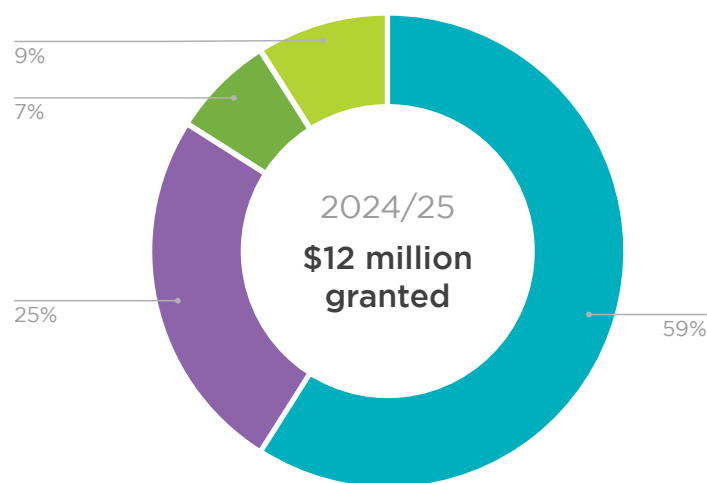
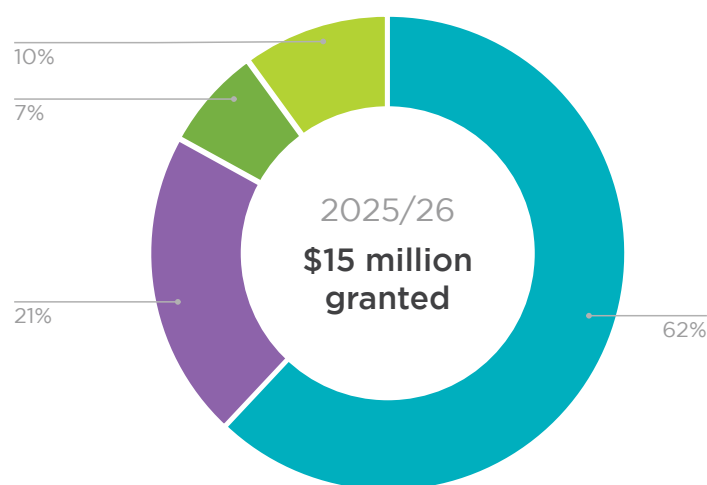
Throughout the year, our leadership teams collaborate on funding priorities aimed at making a meaningful difference for people in East Toronto and its surrounding communities. People who rely on our hospital at some of the most challenging times in their lives.

Progress at a glance

At Michael Garron Hospital, donations are stretched to their furthest extent to:

- Purchase state-of-the-art equipment
- Modernize the hospital's facilities
- Advance patient-oriented research
- Further training and upgrade skills
- Deliver community-based programs

This fiscal year, supporters donated \$23.8 million. Their generosity enabled 140 grants to the hospital for a total of \$15 million. That's a 22% increase in funding over last year. Heartfelt care makes all the difference

A few days into a special trip celebrating his wife Jude’s birthday, Bob Hodgson came down with a sudden fever and nausea. His legs swelled, making it clear an infection was taking hold. At the time, he and Jude were 3,000 km away, off the coast of Venezuela.

A local physician treated him as best he could. Bob also went to a hospital for tests and further care so he could travel home. The gruelling five-hour return flight felt endless as his symptoms worsened and the swelling increased.

The search for answers

On December 23, Bob went to the Stavro Emergency Department at Michael Garron Hospital. He was moved through several zones for extensive testing.

“The waits were long, but every doctor, nurse and specialist worked tirelessly to determine what was wrong and how best to treat it,” says Lindsey, Bob and Jude’s daughter-in-law. “Bob became increasingly disoriented and weak. We realized the seriousness of his condition when we learned his kidney function was dangerously impaired.”

The team diagnosed Bob with a severe case of cellulitis, a skin infection likely caused by an insect bite. It was affecting his organs and made it difficult to move. Bob’s legs were swollen and weeping from infection, and his left hand ballooned to the point he could hardly use it.

A message from our leadership team

With your help this year, we:

- Expanded our Cedric E. Ritchie Cardiac Cath Lab to provide advanced heart care for twice as many patients, up to 3,000 annually
- Funded vital medical equipment, including a new CT scanner that informs screening and diagnosis for more patients while exposing them to less radiation than our previous model
- Hosted education days for clinicians in our Stavro Emergency Department, shining a light on the needs of elderly patients as our population ages
- Brought in technology to help alleviate certain challenges for patients living with breast cancer

Meanwhile, our team is furthering its strong reputation for high-quality care. *Post City Magazine* recognized an impressive 37 of our physicians in their 2026 Top Doctors list. Our hospital also earned Exemplary Standing from Accreditation Canada, which assesses healthcare organizations based on national healthcare standards. In fact, we received a score of 99.9%, our highest yet.

Philanthropy is vital to these successes and many more. This year marked the 10th anniversary of Myron and Berna Garron's historic \$50 million gift to our hospital in loving memory of their son Michael. Their contributions have supported the purchase of urgently needed equipment and established chairs in patient-oriented research and education that highlight our excellence in innovation and academics.

Our gratitude goes to the Garron family and all the donors who join them in strengthening local healthcare. Because of you, we're getting better together. Within these pages, you'll see how.

A week passed as clinicians worked to bring the infection under control. Bob was eventually transferred to our Medical Short Stay Unit, where he received care from specialists in emergency medicine, infectious diseases, wound care, geriatrics and physiotherapy.

“We met Dr. Jarred Rosenberg, a geriatrician, and felt an immediate connection,” says Lindsey. “He took the time to understand Bob as a person, not just a patient – asking about his interests, his life and speaking at length with our family, especially my mother-in-law, to address questions and concerns with compassion and clarity.”

The holidays came and went. “There was tinsel at the nursing stations and porters in Santa hats. It was the sense of community throughout the hospital that truly conveyed the spirit of the season,” Lindsey says.

A new journey begins

Bob moved to one of our medicine units, where he rebuilt his strength and underwent multiple CT scans and tests to ensure his treatment was effective.

Each day brought progress: sitting independently, transferring to a chair, lifting his legs, even brushing his teeth – small milestones that once seemed impossible.

As the colour returned to his cheeks and his humour resurfaced, Bob was transferred to our Helen Aird Carswell Complex Continuing Care Unit. “We often gathered in the Garden Room, where we could step away from the clinical setting and simply be together,” says Lindsey. “We shared meals, stories and laughter, but most importantly time. In difficult moments, one silver lining is how deeply it brings a family together.”

Bob was discharged from our hospital after 44 days. In appreciation, his family made a donation honouring Dr. Rosenberg and nurse Luxmy Karunakaran. “They symbolize the extraordinary care and dedication of the many people across the hospital who supported Bob – and all of us – through this journey,” explains Lindsey.

Improved access to advanced heart care

East Toronto resident Dale Skinner credits Dr. Mohammad Zia and his colleagues in our Cedric E. Ritchie Cardiac Cath Lab for saving her life.

A routine visit to her family doctor alerted Dale to a potential heart issue. She was immediately referred to Dr. Zia, Interventional Cardiologist and Medical Director of Cardiac Program Expansion at Michael Garron Hospital. They met within two weeks and diagnostic tests at our hospital soon followed, culminating in an angiogram in our cath lab to assess arterial plaque build-up and blood flow.

The news? One of Dale's arteries was 70% blocked, with moderate blockages elsewhere. Plaque build-up can trigger a heart attack by restricting blood flow, damaging or even destroying part of the heart muscle.

Dr. Zia treated Dale's severe blockage with angioplasty in the same session. During the procedure, he used real-time X-ray imaging to guide a thin catheter with a tiny balloon and stent (a wire mesh tube) to the artery. He expanded the balloon and stent to open the artery, leaving the stent in place to prevent it from closing.

"Dr. Zia didn't waste any time. He's very good at what he does," says Dale. "I'm here because of Dr. Zia. He saved my life."

She adds that "the cath lab team is a well-oiled machine. Everybody knew what they were supposed to do, and they did it with precision."

Capacity doubled

The team can now care for twice as many patients annually – up to 3,000 people each year – thanks to donor funding for expansion of the cath lab, which was completed in March 2026.

Heather Walton and Ritchie Family, Ange and Adrian Rocca and the Tripp / Smith Family Foundation are among the many donors who enabled us to build a second procedure room, create a larger and more comfortable patient recovery area and outfit the lab with leading-edge equipment.

Reflecting on her experience, Dale is grateful she can access advanced heart care in her community. "It makes a big difference. If something were to happen to me, I can be at Michael Garron Hospital in less than 15 minutes, and that's important." ♥

Progress you can see

It's been another year of transformation at Michael Garron Hospital as we approach completion of this historic phase of our campus redevelopment.

Removal of our outdated A, B, C and F wings wrapped up in November, and care was taken to preserve key artifacts. These include the building cornerstones now displayed in the lobby of our Ken and Marilyn Thomson Patient Care Centre, as well as stained-glass windows commemorating veterans of the Second World War, which will be installed in a prominent area. Much of our original 1929 building (D Wing) has been renovated and is home to leadership and administrative teams.

Come fall 2026, people will be able to enter our hospital through a new main entrance on Coxwell Avenue. Broad walkways and a spacious U-shaped driveway will make drop-offs and pick-ups much easier, while extensive green space will provide a place to relax. This future is already coming into view, with new sidewalks, planters and a pedestrian awning well underway.

Renewed for exceptional care

Redevelopment has also led to the modernization of many areas within our legacy facilities. Over the last year we opened two fully renovated medicine inpatient units that support patients with wide-ranging acute conditions, from pneumonia to broken hips.

Located in H Wing, these units represent a significant upgrade in patient experience and clinical

functionality. For instance, the unit on H7 is “brighter and more spacious. The overall environment just feels much more inviting,” says Stephen Jersak, past manager of the unit and now a manager within our Margaret Chambers Diagnostic Imaging Department.

Meanwhile, a specialized program for young people with complex neurodevelopmental, behavioural, medical and physical needs, as well as social vulnerabilities, moved to more comfortable and collaborative surroundings. The Extensive Needs Service is now located within our Child and Youth Mental Health Outpatient Unit in K Wing, another renovated area. ❤️

Standout performance

Congratulations to EllisDon on winning the Ontario General Contractors Association 2026 award for Project Value Over \$300 Million for their work on our redevelopment. The association commended EllisDon for the quality of its work and the project's impact.

Meeting high demand for emergency care

Our Stavro Emergency Department (ED) is among the busiest in Ontario. This year, our team received 107,137 visits, nearly twice as many patients as the ED was originally designed to accommodate. New equipment and innovations help our team provide timely, expert care that meets high demand.

New X-ray machine

A third of patients in our ED need X-rays to help diagnose lung infections, broken bones, heart disease and other conditions. This keeps the ED's two X-ray machines in nearly constant use. When our oldest machine reached the end of its serviceable life, replacing it was a top priority. In response to this urgency, donors including Peter and Diana Thomson funded a new machine to ensure patients can continue to get the scans they need quickly.

Specialized mental health care

Our new Psychiatric Emergency Zone (PEZ) opened in November to enhance care for the growing number of patients experiencing mental health crises.

Building on the foundation of our former Mental Health Emergency Assessment Zone, the PEZ has an even stronger focus on specialized mental health care. The team is trained to deliver evidence-based care for patients with complex mental health needs. Within four and a half months of the PEZ opening, they supported 960 patient visits and provided mental health care for patients being treated for other health concerns in the main ED.

Designed to help patients of all ages feel calm and supported, the PEZ offers a secure and safe environment for patients and staff alike. Patients who don't need to be admitted as inpatients can stay in the PEZ for up to 72 hours as their conditions stabilize.

Enhancing care for older patients

More than 100 nurses, physicians and clinicians have participated in hands-on education sessions funded by RBC. With junior ED team members learning alongside their more seasoned colleagues, the sessions are boosting confidence and teamwork as well as technical skills.

The seven half-day sessions focused on elderly patients. One-fifth of our ED patients are over age 65, with dementia and mobility issues often adding complexity to their care. Using medical props, a mannequin and weighted clothing to simulate common medical scenarios, the participants gained a deeper understanding of how to help their older patients. ♥

Advancing innovation in patient care

Honouring the ED's former chief, the Dr. Paul Hannam Memorial Fund reflects his commitment to investing in his team's excellence. Since 2024, it has provided annual grants to advance clinician-led innovations that support exceptional emergency care:

- Dr. Inderjeet Sahota trained ED staff in the use of point-of-care ultrasound, which facilitates fast and accurate diagnosis of critically ill patients.
- Dr. Nadia Primiani developed simulation training where clinicians can practice emergency medicine scenarios, fostering better communication and collaboration.
- Dr. Alvin Yang, the 2026 recipient, is developing a multilingual online tool that helps patients know what to expect during their ED visit. The first of its kind in Canada, it aims to reduce patients' anxiety by answering their questions in advance.

Closing the gender health gap

Many health conditions affect women differently or disproportionately, and this can lead to misdiagnoses and undertreatment.

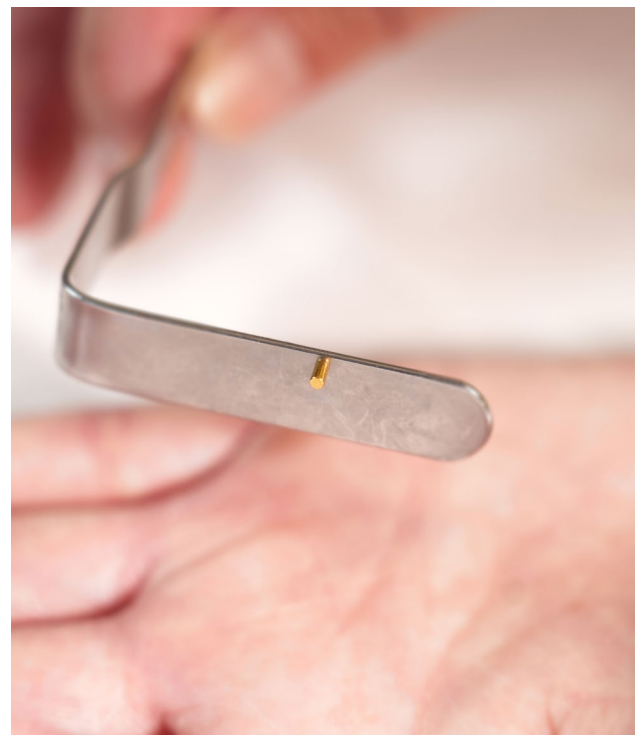
To address gaps in women's healthcare, donors Pauline Alimchandani, Catriona Read and Ange Rocca banded together to establish a fund dedicated to enhancing care for female-identifying patients at Michael Garron Hospital. They launched it at 4Women, an event that brought guests fresh insights from the frontlines of care.

"For decades medicine has been built around a male default. Symptoms women experience are dismissed as stress or anxiety. Pain is minimized. Conditions are diagnosed later, treated incorrectly or not treated at all," says Dr. Courtney Joliffe, Obstetrician and Gynecologist. "Ignoring these realities isn't just outdated, it's dangerous. But we now know better. And that means we can do better."

Donations enabled the purchase of MOLLI technology, which will alleviate some of the challenges associated with breast cancer treatment. Without MOLLI, patients would undergo uncomfortable wire insertions to mark breast tumours for surgery. From there, they'd be transferred to the operating room as quickly as possible because significant movement could cause the wires to dislodge. Patients awaiting surgery had to limit their movement, heightening tension at an already difficult time.

Improving care for patients living with breast cancer

With support from the new women's fund, MOLLI is now in a phased implementation at our hospital. Leveraging a minimally invasive approach, MOLLI involves the insertion of a tiny magnetic seed in the breast to mark the tumour. This localizing procedure takes place days ahead of surgery and allows patients to return home in the lead-up to their operation, when the cancerous lump is removed and sent for imaging.



"Because this technology offers greater precision, the likelihood of having to remove additional tissue is significantly reduced. This being the case, MOLLI gives us the ability to do more lumpectomies in a day, meaning we can provide timely cancer care to more women," says Dr. Gaya Naganathan, Breast Surgical Oncologist and General Surgeon.

"With MOLLI, we can also save more of the breast tissue, which helps patients feel like their body is still their own." ❤️

Your support in action

With donor investment, our teams are better equipped to care for the patients who rely on us. Here are some examples of what you made possible over the last fiscal year.

CT scanner

“Michael Garron Hospital now has one of the most advanced CT scanners in Canada, thanks to donor support,” says Dr. Noah Ditzkofsky, Chief of Medical Imaging. CT scans are crucial for lung cancer screening, identifying blood vessel blockages and many other diagnostic procedures. Compared to the machine it replaced, our new scanner can complete more scans per day and help to detect disease earlier. This means patients can start treatment sooner, enabling better health outcomes and lowering health system costs.

Open-care warmers for newborns

These are especially critical for babies born prematurely, underweight or in need of resuscitation. Used in our Family Birthing Centre and our Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, warmers stabilize babies’ body temperature while allowing unobstructed access for medical procedures, including life-saving interventions. Our new warmers offer greater reliability and bring more uniformity to our equipment, which simplifies staff training and increases efficiency.

Minimally invasive surgical gear

We outfitted an operating room with new equipment for laparoscopic procedures that result in smaller incisions, less pain and improved recovery compared to open surgery. The gear includes a tiny camera that captures images of the surgical site, a processor that transfers the images to video screens and a light source that illuminates the body cavity. New overhead lights also aid surgeons as they perform lung, abdominal, gynaecological and urological procedures, and other operations.

Bladder scanners and vein finders

In our Stavro Emergency Department and throughout our hospital, ultrasound-based bladder scanners are used to assess urinary function and provide information to support diagnosis and treatment. This reduces the need for catheters that can cause patients discomfort and urinary tract infections. Meanwhile, vein-finding equipment enables our emergency team to visualize hard-to-see veins and makes it easier to successfully insert needles on first attempt. For patients, this means fewer pokes and less stress.

Giving youth somewhere to turn

Sonya, 24, felt “lost and confused” before connecting with the Youth Outreach Team (YOT), a collaborative mental health program.

Designated male at birth, Sonya struggled with her gender identity and felt unsafe sharing this with her family. Her mental health suffered. She had difficulty in high school and spent much of her time isolated at home. In Grade 10 she started considering suicide and was briefly hospitalized for her own safety.

After years of living in an emotionally abusive home environment, she eventually couldn’t escape thoughts of suicide. “The ideation I was experiencing was so intense,” says Sonya.

That’s when she contacted YOT. Today, after a year of comprehensive support, Sonya has stability in her life. She shared part of her journey with us to offer hope to others.

Bringing hope

Launched in 2024, YOT is made possible by a \$1.7 million gift from The Slight Family Foundation. Michael Garron Hospital and WoodGreen Community Services developed the program to address a critical gap in care for youth aged 16-29 living with complex mental health or substance use challenges. The team’s support encompasses psychiatric care, counselling, resource navigation, case management and peer support.

YOT’s impact continues to grow. It served 30 clients between August 2024 and March 2025, and 47 from April 2025 to March 2026.

YOT members helped Sonya accept her gender identity and work through built-up emotional trauma. The team’s psychiatrist determined the cause of the hallucinations Sonya was experiencing and prescribed effective medication.

Through a YOT art program, Sonya rediscovered her joy for artistic expression, which her family had discouraged. She’s titled this painting *Cold Nervous Hope*.

Soon after Sonya engaged with YOT, her dad kicked her out and she resorted to sleeping in a stairwell. She was also seeking to evade an abuser who attempted to traffic her. YOT members quickly collaborated with another organization to help Sonya secure temporary accommodation while awaiting space at a youth shelter.

Using the YOT client support fund, they assisted Sonya with essential needs by providing grocery gift cards. The fund also facilitated gender-affirming facial hair removal that’s helped Sonya feel more assured.

Sonya says YOT has given her skills to manage her mental health and the confidence to chart a career path. She hopes to become a counsellor who aids youth living with anxiety and trauma. “My goal is to be the hands that feed, to reduce the suffering of others.” ♥

Medical education program grows

Our Carswell Family Centre for Medical Education is busier than ever. This year, we welcomed learners from the Toronto Metropolitan University (TMU) School of Medicine for the first time. Together with those from our long-standing partnership with the University of Toronto's Faculty of Medicine, a total 376 medical students and 684 resident physicians completed rotations at our hospital, 30% more than the previous year.

Dr. Rodney Chan was part of the first cohort of TMU psychiatry residents. He praises the supportive learning culture he found here and says the experience confirmed his career plans. "I definitely want to practice psychiatry in a community-based environment like Michael Garron Hospital."

He's not alone. After completing residency rotations here, many learners return to our hospital as staff physicians.

This year, to maintain a high-quality educational experience, we recruited 21 new faculty for a total of 49 members

Bringing more nurses onboard

Between October and December 2025, 113 nurses joined our hospital, a significant increase in a relatively short period of time. These new team members were urgently needed to help address surging patient volumes during cold and flu season, as well as to staff our new Psychiatric Emergency Zone.

All new nurses participate in an orientation to ensure they are familiar with our hospital procedures. Led by advanced practice nurse educators, it involves classroom learning, hands-on simulations and computer training.

Scaling up the orientation required collaboration with departments throughout the hospital, says Rozina Ramrattan, Corporate Clinical Resource Leader.

"It was an impressive team effort to coordinate the training space, facilitators and digital infrastructure on a tight timeline," she says. "It demonstrates our strong commitment to ensuring patient-centred care during periods of increased demand."

While there aren't plans to continue hiring nurses at such a fast pace, "we now know that we can ramp up quickly to bring a higher number onboard when necessary," says Rozina. ❤️

East End Adventure brings community together



Part scavenger hunt, part fun fair, our first-ever East End Adventure brought together hundreds of residents and hospital staff members last October. With help from local businesses, participants raised over \$440,000 to support our hospital's most pressing needs and emerging priorities. Building on this success, East End Adventure returns October 17, 2026 to enhance healthcare for everyone in our communities.

Connecting our patients with primary care

For hospital patients who don't have a family doctor, our new East Toronto Primary Care Navigation Clinic provides a critical link. It offers short-term care while helping its patients access ongoing support from local family medicine practices.

Jean-Delacroix Landa was one of the clinic's first patients. He was referred for follow-up care after a diabetes-related infection led to a two-week hospital stay. The clinic also connected Jean-Delacroix with a local organization which now supports him with primary care from a nurse practitioner.

"I don't know what would have happened if the clinic hadn't taken me on," says Jean-Delacroix. "They took such good care of me, helping me with wound care and to manage my blood sugar levels."

Jean-Delacroix's situation is not unusual: one in five East Toronto residents doesn't have a family doctor. Studies show that people without access to primary care have higher rates of preventable disease. This can lead to a greater need for emergency care and hospitalization.

"We see many patients in the East Toronto Primary Care Navigation Clinic who have trouble finding primary care due to language barriers, precarious living conditions or mental health challenges," says Dorothy Quon, Director, Integrated Care at Michael Garron Hospital, who co-leads the clinic. "They often require support beyond their physical health needs. Our team helps patients address concerns at an early stage and prevent worsening health that would require more intensive attention later."

The clinic team includes a physician, nurses, a counsellor, a health navigator and a unit clerk. While helping patients stabilize their health, the team assists them with accessing community supports and permanent primary care. In its first five months, the clinic served 313 patients. Of those, 91% were connected to family practices for ongoing care.

The clinic is offered in collaboration with WoodGreen Community Services, Flemingdon Health Centre and TNO - The Neighbourhood Organization, with funding from the Ontario government. ❤️

Looking ahead

With your support, our future looks bright. This fall, our dedicated eye surgery centre will open on Wynford Drive. By relocating cataract procedures, it will free capacity at Michael Garron Hospital for patients awaiting surgery for cancer and other complex procedures that must take place within our walls.

The Scarborough Academy of Medicine and Integrated Health launches soon. It will advance our partnership with University of Toronto by increasing knowledge creation and sharing to enhance our communities locally and farther afield. An announcement about our first Michael Garron Chair in Education is forthcoming, thanks to a visionary gift from Myron and Berna Garron that underlines our hospital's strengths in training the next generation of healthcare leaders.

Together with our communities, we are striving to ensure everyone has access to exceptional healthcare bolstered by modern spaces and state-of-the-art equipment. Fundraising continues for critical tools that facilitate prompt diagnosis as well as leading-edge technology for minimally invasive procedures that enable patients to recover faster.

As East Toronto continues to grow, so do demands on our hospital. Already, the limitations of our capacity are being felt, particularly in our Stavro Emergency Department, where the team sees almost twice as many patients as our original facilities were built to support. With a request for funding now filed with the Ministry of Health, we are eager to shore up capacity in the near term.
